

OVERVIEW OF INTEGRATED CURRICULUM WORKSHOP





A practical 2 day 'hands on' workshop for teachers following an integrated classroom curriculum as they create a mural of their community.

For teachers or children

My Community

Hooking the teachers and children in to what's happening in their community, with a focus upon engagement strategies that work.

The program can be run with groups of teachers or in a classroom alongside a teacher / assistant/ parent with the Drawing to Learn leader.

In My Community the group will explore their surroundings through...

- **a.** Exploring what's happening in the community using an integrated planning model that includes an exhibition at the end of the final day.
- **b.** Developing a mural of the community.
- **c.** Creating a puppet that will be used to tell the story of the mural. That is, describing what is happening in the community, using an inquiry question that the participants wanted to explore.

The educational focus will be upon:

- Cooperative learning strategies in group work
- Art/Craft/design. A different technique at each phase/task.
- Using levels of questioning to deepen the inquiry.
- Integrating the Australian curriculum to assist in exploring the inquiry question.
- Following a narrative structure to tell the puppet story of 'What is happening in the community?'
- Using a publishing app to recored the narrative of the mural.
- Integrating the project across the curriculum ares e.g., Literacy, Language, HASS, Science, ICT, Mathematics, Art and Craft and Design.

Co-operative work on calico mural and individual work in scrapbooks

- Create a puppet character that will tell a story of something happening within the community on a mural. What does the character want to learn about the community? Inquiry questioning! What's happening in my community?
- 2. Layout of the community mural on calico and then in individual scrapbooks : mapping
- 3. Wash of whole scene: Highlight pathways
- 4. Homes
- 5. Gardens, forests, trees, paddocks, fields
- 6. Water, boats, fish, birds
- 7. Shops, restaurants, churches, schools, homes, grocery, council buildings
- 8. Roads, paths, cars, bicycles, trucks and walkers
- 9. Final scene with people: Completed
- 10. Puppet story within the community of the mural: Narrative: 8 frames : 1 sheet of paper
- **11.** Narrative uploaded online on the 'wepublish' app of the puppet's story within the community mural created.
- 12. Final presentation: My community mural, Puppet and Narrative: This is what's happening!

Each phase/task will highlight a different art/craft technique and a specific focus for each of the 12 activities.







Create a Paper bag or felt puppet character that will tell a story within the community.

- What does the character want to learn about the community?
- What is the character's name?
- What does he/ she do?
- Inquiry questioning!




Pencil/Black outline pens: Layout of the community on mural: mapping.

- What goes where?
- Mountains? Rivers? City/country?



Crepe paper, card, wool, buttons, sequins:

- Gardens, forests, trees, paddocks, fields, animals, green spaces.
- Filling in the scene.



Cellophane, felt, bamboo, crepe paper:

- Water, boats, fish, birds: movement in the water.
- Who needs the water?




Pop stick, matches, felt:

- Shops, restaurants, church, houses, council, school, Doctors etc.
- What makes up this community?



Paint wash of community scene from edge to edge of mural.

• Getting the scene right.



Pop stick and match stick homes.

- Doors, windows , roofs chimneys, steps, etc.
- What goes where?
- Who lives next door? Who lives across the road? Etc.



Pipe cleaners, card, wire: movement within the community:

- Connections roads & pathways.
- How? Cars, bicycles, trucks, walking, sailing.

- Answer to the inquiry?


10 & 11 Puppet character: story within the mural. Narrative: 8 frames
